Departmental Policies

- CS Electives include 15 units of 300-400 level CS courses.
- Technical electives include 9 units of 200-level or above, from science and engineering disciplines: AST, BIO, CENE (excluding CENE 225), CHM, CS, EE, GLG, GSP, INF, MAT, ME, PHY and STA (excluding STA 270 or STA 275). You may petition the department chair for approval of courses with other prefixes.

Program Policies

- UA courses required for the NAU degree must be completed with the equivalent of a grade of C or higher to transfer to NAU.
- Required courses that were not transferred due to grades below a C will result in additional classes at NAU.
- Dual degree students follow a special “post-bac” program. Students should be treated as they are following a second degree, plus foundations and ethnic diversity.
- UA students must successfully complete a minimum of 30 units at NAU in order to graduate with a bachelor’s degree.
- Most courses have prerequisites. Please check the Academic Catalog for prerequisite information.
- This Articulation Plan is intended as a planning tool to help define a path towards graduation. It does not constitute a contract with the University.
- Students should see an academic advisor regularly to confirm academic progress and to prepare for graduation
